

Behaviour Policy for Home Education Group

At Emily Fox Tuition, we strive to create a positive, respectful, and focused environment during each session. This policy outlines the expected behaviours to ensure the safety and well-being of all participants while maintaining a conducive learning atmosphere.

Expectations for Behaviour:

1. Respect for Others:

Ochildren are expected to treat their peers, the tutor, and the home environment with kindness and respect at all times. This includes speaking to one another in a polite and courteous manner, refraining from interrupting others, and being supportive of each other's ideas and efforts.

2. Safety First:

 Running, throwing, or engaging in any dangerous or disruptive behaviour is not allowed in the house. Children must move around the space calmly and respectfully to prevent accidents.

3. Use of Materials:

o Children should handle all educational materials, toys, or equipment gently and with care. Damaging or misusing resources is not acceptable.

Managing Behaviour:

- At the beginning of every session, the behaviour expectations will be outlined, ensuring that children understand the guidelines for respectful participation.
- If a child is consistently disruptive or fails to meet the behaviour expectations, they will be reminded of the rules and given an opportunity to correct their behaviour.

Consequences for Breaching the Behaviour Policy:

- **Initial Reminders:** Children who breach the behaviour expectations will receive a gentle reminder of the rules. We aim to correct behaviour in a positive and constructive manner.
- Parental Notification: If a child repeatedly breaks the behaviour policy, despite reminders, the parent or guardian will be informed. We will discuss the behaviour concerns and work together to find a solution.
- **Termination of Participation:** Continued disruptive or inappropriate behaviour may result in the child not being invited back to future sessions. We reserve the right to remove



a child from the study group if their behaviour is consistently disruptive or unsafe, and this will be communicated to parents promptly.

By signing up for the sessions, parents agree to these behaviour expectations and acknowledge the possibility of their child not returning if the expectations are consistently not met.
